Membership Requirements:

The NHSRA is organized on the State/Provincial level as well as on the National Level. There are 39 states, 5 Canadian Provinces and Australia in the Association. The following are the major requirements a student must meet to be eligible to join.

1. A student must first become a member of his or her provincial high school rodeo association before he or she may gain National membership
2. Membership dues must be paid for the Provincial and National enrollment, paid through the OHSRA. When these are paid you will receive a membership card and a subscription to the NHSRA Times, the official publication of the National High School Rodeo Association. A subscription runs for one year from time of joining.
3. A student member must be under twenty (20) years of age at the beginning of the NHSRA fiscal year (beginning Sept 1) and be enrolled in the 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade, to be able to participate in approved High School Rodeos, a maximum of 4 years of Secondary School. A member must be enrolled in the 6th, 7th or 8th grade, to be able to participate in approved Jr High Rodeos.
4. A student must have passing grades in four subjects or if carrying less than four, a student must have passing grades in all subjects. They must not be ruled as undesirable for misconduct and must be in good standing at the school they are attending.
5. If a student has graduated in the middle of the year or has attended school on a half-day basis, he or she will be eligible to compete in the High School Rodeo through the Finals of that year.
6. Students must enroll in the OHSRA to participate in the rodeos.
7. Each student must enclose a transcript of his or her school grades, and a photocopy of their birth certificate or passport with his or her application for membership in the State/Province association.
8. In order to collect all earned scholarship points, the student must remain a member in good standing from the time they join the provincial association until they graduate. If the student takes a year off and does not pay their membership fee, they are not eligible to collect previous scholarship points. If they rejoin, they start as if they are brand new members as far as points go.
9. If a student joins as a junior member, they must remain in good standing with the association until they graduate from high school in order to be eligible for all points earned.
